
BST 310 Old Testament I

Purpose: The purpose of this course is to help students develop an understanding and appreciation of the Pentateuch and the Historical Books of the Old Testament.

Learning Outcomes: By the end of this study, students should be able to:

- 2. Comprehend the historical background reflected in the Old Testament.
- 3. Understand the history of the composition of the texts in the Old Testament.
- 4. Discuss the literary character and structure evident within the various divisions of the Old Testament.
- 5. Discuss the various approaches related to the study of the Old Testament.
- 6. Identify the main themes and theological concepts revealed in the Old Testament.
- 7. Appreciate the significance of Scripture for Ancient Israel and its application in the Christian Church.
